There is a new glade park for the snowboarders and freeskiers as well. ONE Glade Park with wooden natural features is located to the rider's right off ONE Park, which features the J-Rod Shed. For the advanced skiers Jack Frost has widened Challenge Slope and cleaned up the glade area on Challenge and East Mountain.

Peak Resorts takes pride in its snowmaking. This season it added 50 new low energy snow guns to an already large number of snowmaking equipment.

In the E-2000 Lounge, the music is live through the new sound system. During the extended entertainment hours, featuring DJ Jeff Walden and the best in regional party bands, the music can be heard outside from the top of A-lift to the top of D-lift. In addition, the resort has added more lockers to save you the hassle of carrying your gear back and forth.

Once again, for the third year in a row, Big Boulder Park was voted in the top five in terrain parks from TransWorld Magazine, a national snowboard publication. The resort was busy all summer creating new features. To support this they added to the snowmaking fleet with the latest in SMI Pole Cats. Big Boulder was given a facelift this year – all the chairlifts and towers were painted.

ENVIRONMENTAL CODE OF THE SLOPES
WHAT SKIERS and RESORT GUESTS CAN DO TO HELP
Follow the Leave No Trace™ Principles of outdoor ethics:

- **Plan ahead and prepare:**
Know the regulations and special concerns of the area you will visit, prepare for winter weather, and consider off-peak visits when scheduling your trip.
- **Dispose of waste properly:**
Recycle your glass, plastics, aluminum and paper at resorts. Reuse trail maps on your next visit or recycle them. Never throw trash, cigarette butts or other items from the lifts.
- **Respect wildlife:**
Observe trail closures, seasonal closures, and ski area boundaries. These closures are in place not only for your safety, but

- the well being of plants and animals located in sensitive areas. In summer, stick to designated trails when hiking and biking to avoid disturbances to vegetation and wildlife.
- **Be considerate:**
Respect other guests, protect the quality of their experience; let nature's sounds prevail.
Carpool with friends and family or use transit to avoid traffic when travelling to and within the ski area.
Turn off the lights when leaving your room and reuse bath towels and linens to help conserve energy.
